Stigma and the Health of Minoritised Populations: Minority Stress (Still) Matters

The minority stress model has emerged as a seminal framework for illuminating the determinants of health disparities experienced by stigmatised and minoritised populations. Integrating insights from psychology, sociology, public health, and social welfare, this model elucidates the multifaceted social, psychological, and structural adversities faced by these populations, as well as the resultant impacts on various health and well-being outcomes. This talk will delve into recent theoretical advancements and empirical extensions of the minority stress model. Additionally, it will critically examine the relevance of the minority stress model within rapidly changing social contexts alongside the related challenges that such social changes pose for research on stigma and health.
